




Your HOME Team

This week, the Board of Supervisors unanimously passed my initiative to start a pilot program that directly serves those experiencing homelessness who have a mental illness. The Homeless Outreach and Mobile Engagement teams, known as HOME teams, provide treatment and resources for those who need our help. The teams are comprised of psychiatrists, nurses, social workers, counselors, case workers, and peers who use their areas of expertise to address this crisis from every

angle and ensure patients receive caring treatment and supportive housing.

While we continue to combat the ongoing pandemic, the HOME teams provide us with an important reminder. To make a difference, it requires compassionate collaborators using their unique skills for a common goal. Right now, this means we all do our part by practicing distancing, supporting local businesses, and caring for those in need. Let's work to make our families healthier, our neighbors' lives better, and our communities stronger for everyone who calls L.A. County home.


3 Million Miles


Drive-in Movies
