



County COVID-19 Community Equity Fund - Apply Today

The LA County Department of Health Services and the LA County Department of Public Health in partnership with Community Partners will be launching the County COVID-19 Community Equity Fund to serve communities disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 epidemic through resources and prevention.

The [County COVID-19 Community Equity Fund](#) will form partnerships with selected grassroots community-based organizations (CBOs) that possess cultural and linguistic expertise and their community's trust to reach historically under-resourced and hard to reach communities. Selected CBOs will receive funding, mentorship, training and technical assistance to support their internal infrastructure, workforce and sustainability as they provide prevention services, activities and social and medical resources to their communities.

Funding Available: Ranges from \$100,000 to \$500,000 per organization.

Eligibility Requirements: The selection of agencies will involve an application review process that considers specific criteria, including but not limited to the following:

- Demonstrated experience providing culturally and linguistically appropriate services to prioritized individuals/groups
- Provides services in prioritized regions/communities
- Have a 501(c)3 non-profit status or be fiscally-sponsored by an organization with 501(c)3 non-profit status (includes faith-based communities) or run by a federally-recognized tribe
- Demonstrate in-house or ready access to language translation/interpretation services, if working with limited English proficient (LEP) communities
- Demonstrated history advancing racial equity for prioritized individuals/groups and regions/communities



City of Pasadena, National CORE, & Union Station Homeless Services Move Forward with Proposed Senior Affordable Housing at Civic Center

In a unanimous vote on Monday, October 19, the **Pasadena City Council** gave the approval to begin negotiations for the development of a senior affordable housing community on a city-owned parcel of land across from City Hall. The proposed development will provide 112 stunning apartment homes for low-income seniors with an average affordability of 50% of the area median income, with 10 percent of the apartment homes set-aside for permanent supportive housing.

“We are honored to have been chosen to work alongside the City of Pasadena to provide an affordable housing community that complements the beautiful historic Civic Center District,” said **National Community Renaissance (National CORE)** President and CEO Steve PonTell. “At National CORE, we have a long history of creating high-quality, healthy, equitable communities that offer accessibility, affordability, stability, diversity, and safety.”

With 10 percent of the apartment homes set aside for formerly homeless seniors, National CORE, in partnership with **Union Station Homeless Services**, will provide the platform for formerly homeless seniors to begin the process of rebuilding their lives. With the programs and services provided by Union Station Homeless Services, residents will have a support system as well as access to programs and services to promote housing stability and individual well-being.
