A Letter from Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda L. Solis

Dear Friends,

May is Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month and I am proud to represent a County that is home to over 1.5 million AAPI residents. Their contributions can be found in every aspect of society, from politics, entertainment, education, technology and much more. But as we celebrate their heritage, I cannot stress enough how critical it is for us to stop hate incidents and crimes against our AAPI community members, which have significantly increased during the pandemic. I am horrified to see the rise of anti-AAPI hate. All people deserve to feel safe and move about freely without becoming targets of racism and harassment.

A recent survey indicated that more than a third of the residents in the San Gabriel Valley, an area I represent, have witnessed or experienced an act of hate or harassment in recent years due to COVID-19 scapegoating. This is unacceptable. That is why I'm so happy the Board of Supervisors approved my motion this past Tuesday to fully support the Stop AAPI Hate's *No Place for Hate* California legislative package to address street harassment, on public transit and in private businesses.

It is critical to report acts of hate such as verbal or physical aggression, refusal of service, bullying, or intimidation of any kind that is motivated by hostile prejudice. We cannot do anything to stop hate crimes and incidents unless we know about them, so that victims do not suffer in silence. If you or someone you know has been a victim of a hate crime, please report it by calling 211 or visiting lavshate.org/report to file an anonymous online report.

Celebrating the Façade Improvement of Mariscos Martin



So honored to celebrate the completion of the Mariscos Martin Façade Improvement Project. The façade improvement was funded at \$203,355 by the LA County Department of Workforce Development, Aging and Community Service through a RENOVA program grant and included new painting, electrical work, lighting, new stucco, new doors and windows, a new entry canopy, signage, parking lot striping, and ADA accessibility enhancements.

Like so many businesses, Mariscos Martin struggled throughout the pandemic. But the Robeldo's family commitment to weathering the storm by continuing to serve authentic Mexican seafood led them to the County where we were willing to provide immediate relief. Thank you for trusting us. I'm grateful for the opportunity to support our small business community and ensuring that they continue to thrive for many years.

More Affordable Housing Coming to East Hollywood!



Through a partnership between Metro and Little Tokyo Service Center, the East Hollywood community will soon see the realization of the Santa Monica Vermont Apartments — a 187-unit affordable housing project for low-income families, with half of the units reserved as permanent supportive housing for people experiencing homelessness. This project is an example of how innovative thinking and strategic partnerships can make sustainable, equitable development a reality.

Developing housing on Metro-owned land is making a difference in the lives of Angelenos throughout LA County and we will continue to work to deliver on our promise of developing 5,000 affordable housing units by 2031.


