Something especially magical about live music in the summer when you're surrounded by trees and have a gorgeous view of the foothills behind you.

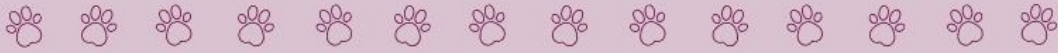

Your Dollars at Work

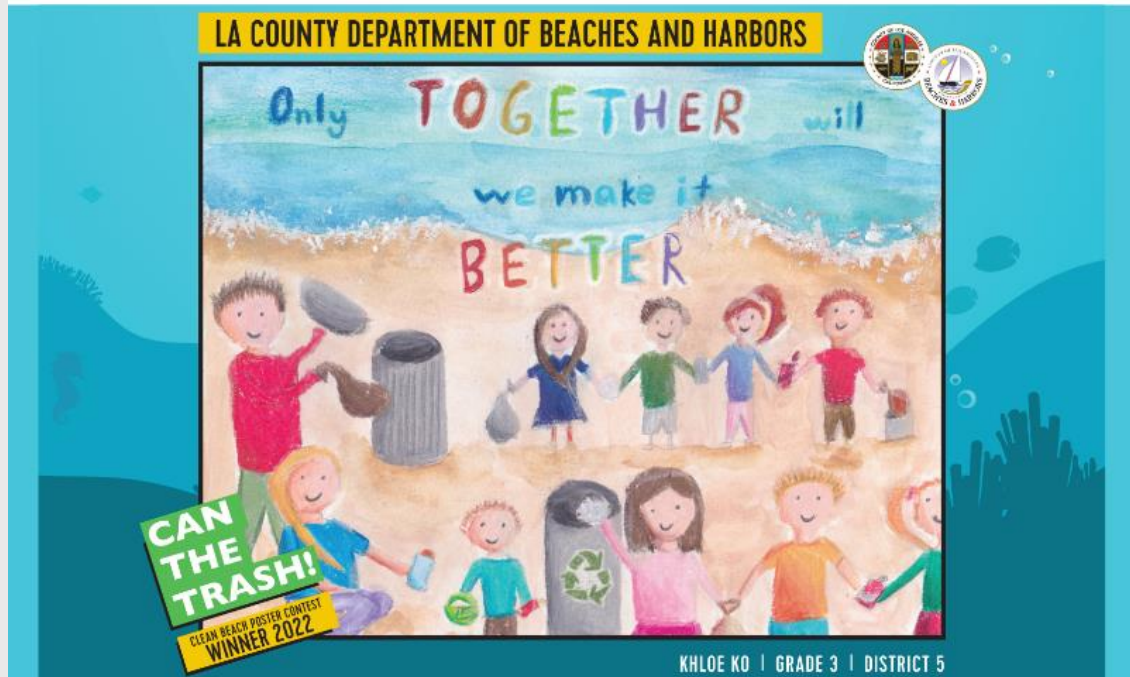


Whether high-profile or low-key,
