A Letter from Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda L. Solis

Dear Friends,

Earlier this week, the Board of Supervisors unanimously approved my motion, co-authored by Supervisor Kuehl, to implement a Gender Impact Assessment (GIA) for County departments. This tool is part of the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development to study gender inequalities, looking at both the symptoms and the causes, and providing a framework to help tackle these issues head-on.

This motion requires all departments to complete the GIA with a focus on identifying and tracking gender equity-related goals and advancing gender data maturity within their programs, services, policies, practices, and partnerships. By using this methodology and assessing gender data, departments can finely pinpoint gender imbalances within their organization and the services they offer County residents. It's important to note that GIA is not limited to women but to people of all genders.

Achieving gender equity is a multi-year effort. It requires us to question assumptions that our services affect everyone in the same way and apply an intersectional gender lens to improve our services. This includes better data tracking to identify gender imbalances and robust goals across each County department to improve our responsibility as an employer and service provider when it comes to women, girls, and residents of all genders.

I look forward to seeing a more equitable LA County with improved programs and services for all residents and employees.

If you are a childcare provider working in LA County, you may be eligible to receive between \$15,000 and \$80,000 for your childcare business.

To qualify, childcare providers must be:

- Located in Los Angeles County, but not within the City of Los Angeles, and have an "active" child care license.
- Currently operating OR y closed due to the COVID-19 public health emergency to reopen.

The deadline to apply is Tuesday, February 14, 2023. The application is available in several languages.
