Dear Friends,

This Veterans Day, we cannot forget the many sacrifices our women and men in uniform have made for our freedoms. Many of our Veterans have gone or are currently going through their transition to civilian life and some have had more challenges than others in that transition. To that end, we must continue to address gaps and ensure that no Veteran goes without the proper assistance in leading an effortless return.

As a former Secretary of Labor, I often witnessed the challenges Veterans experienced in finding employment. Veterans or their family members were not connecting with the job market upon their return home, so I worked with the Department of Veterans Affairs to help make that happen. And as Supervisor, I have worked to expand and build upon the needed infrastructure to create a better path for our Veterans.

After receiving a tour of Patriotic Hall during my first few months as Supervisor, I noticed the state-of-the-art kitchen and thought it would be a great opportunity to start a Veteran Culinary Arts program. So, with local stakeholders, we began to build a path to create suitable training and employment. This program was for Veterans and their immediate family members – at one point leading to a father and daughter graduating from the program together! And today was no different. My office hosted a Veterans Resource Fair in East LA where Veterans and their families were able to connect with much-needed services, such as employers, medical services, and education counselors, among many more services.

From boosting employment opportunities to supporting aging Veterans through regional partnerships, I am committed to doing better for our Veterans. It is because of their sacrifice and courage that our communities continue to thrive.

The Los Angeles County Development Authority just launched the Senior Grant Program which provides grants (up to \$15,000) for mobility and habitability repairs to eligible low-income seniors in Supervisorial Districts 1, 2, 4, and 5. Seniors interested in applying for the Program must be homeowners over 62 years old, low-income, and must own their own home.

Examples of modifications include wheelchair ramps, grab bars, widened doorways, non-slip floor covering, or conversions from tubs to roll-in showers. Additionally, the Program will finance deferred maintenance repairs such as roofing, plumbing, electrical, or heating that are necessary to improve the structural integrity of the home and prolong the home's useful age.

If you are a childcare provider working in LA County, you may be eligible to receive between \$15,000 and \$80,000 for your childcare business.

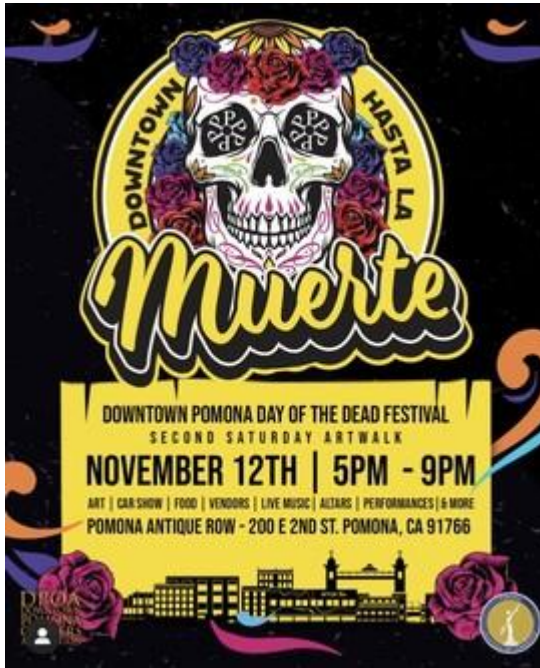
To qualify, childcare providers must be:

- Located in Los Angeles County, but not within the City of Los Angeles, and have an "active" child care license.
- Currently operating OR y closed due to the COVID-19 public health emergency to reopen.

The application will be open from Tuesday, November 15 to February 14, 2023.
