California Competes Tax Credit Program



The California Competes Tax Credit (CCTC) is an income tax credit available to businesses that want to locate in California or stay and grow in California. Businesses of any industry, size, or location compete for over \$180 million available in tax credits by applying in one of the three application periods each year.

For the remainder of the 2022-2023, applications for the CCTC will be accepted during the following periods:

January 3, 2023- January 23, 2023

March 6, 2023- March 20, 2023

Eastern Los Angeles Regional Center



The [Eastern Los Angeles Regional Center](#) (ELARC) is a non profit case management agency contracted with the State of California to provide services to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) including autism, intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, and seizure disorder. Serving over 13,000 children, adults, and their families, ELARC is one of [21 Regional Centers in California](#) and one of seven in Los Angeles County. San Gabriel falls within the ELARC service area. Individuals with I/DD are entitled to a meaningful life in their community as outlined in a California law known as the Lanterman Act.

Components of a meaningful life can include employment and social/recreational opportunities. ELARC Employment staff, in coordination with ELARC service coordinators, provide consumers, who express an interest in seeking competitive and integrated employment (CIE), with a variety of “paid” employment options and, where appropriate, pre-employment training referrals, at a scheduled employment consultation. ELARC offers numerous employment opportunities that include referrals to group or individual supported employment placement offered at the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR), individual “paid” internship placements offered through the State Department of Developmental Services (DDS), and additional employment programs offered at regional American Job Centers (AJC). All employment placements include the support of a professional job-coach. Currently, ELARC oversees all facets of DDS’s popular and successful Paid Internship Program (PIP). Consumers who choose to participate in PIP can work up to 1,040 hours per year, are paid at least minimum wage, work alongside peers with or without disabilities, are eligible for promotion, and receive the assistance of a one-on-one professional job coach for every hour they work. ELARC supports the individuals we serve in having access to inclusive opportunities to play, exercise, and enjoy leisure activities within their own communities through funding for local programs available to those without disabilities, as well as funding for support to enable that access such as paying for an aide or providing training. Currently ELARC is actively working with our community to enhance integration of the individuals we serve into those everyday social recreational activities that are available to everyone.
